Supporting our Students

With your support, students from Detroit, Harper Woods, Pontiac, Sterling Heights, and Warren will start their journey with us in 10th grade and have structured support until they start their careers!

10th Grade School-based Mentoring

Students at our participating schools are matched with career mentors for the school year. During one of their classes, our team facilitates a motivational lesson on the topic of the day. Following the lesson, mentors meet with their students in groups to reinforce the day's lesson through hands-on activities and discussions. Topics include goal setting, career exploration, continuing education, and life and job readiness skills development. All mentoring is onsite at the school in the morning.



11th and 12th Grade One-on-One Mentoring

Students who were in our program last year continue with their mentors. The one-on-one matches meet virtually each month and watch a 5-minute video on a specific topic (education and career exploration, right fit, strategic planning, college obstacles, job readiness skills). Mentors are provided talking points to reinforce the lesson. Additional touchpoints are not structured. Students also participate in workshops and tours with our team focusing on college and career experiences.



College Success Mentoring

Winning Futures alumni who are currently in a continuing education program are matched with a mentor for a onehour monthly video call. This topic-based approach supports students through their trade school or college experience to help them stay in school, get connected to internship opportunities, and secure a job in their career field. Additional touchpoints through the month are unstructured. Students may enroll in this program from one to four years.

Volunteer Opportunities

School-Based Mentoring: We lead a brief lesson and activity. Following the lesson, mentors meet with their students in groups to reinforce the day's lesson through activities and discussions. Topics include goal setting, career exploration, continuing education, and life and job readiness skills development (16, one-hour sessions November-May).

Mentor with College Success Mentoring: One employee from upper management will be recruited to mentor a student who is in trade school or college. Mentoring is once per month with a virtual meeting scheduled by the mentor and student. Each month Winning Futures supplies you with a topic, talking points, and activity. The goal is to support the student in completing their continuing education while helping them find an internship and full-time job.

Scholarship Judging: In April, help us choose scholarship recipients by interviewing students who apply or judging their application essays. Interviews will be conducted through Zoom (one time for three hours). Essays will be emailed to judges to read and score over a two-week period.

Resume Review: Human resources and hiring managers who volunteer will review and critique 3-6 resumes submitted by our College Success students (alumni now in college).
