MAKING AN IMPACT IN DETROIT PUBLIC SCHOOLS

As we celebrate our 17th year, we are proud to announce our expansion into the Detroit Public Schools (DPS)! This year, we hosted mentoring programs at two DPS schools.

The impact has already been amazing. One mentee, Edward, spontaneously stood up in class to share: "When I first heard about the program, I didn't think I would like it. I was not making good decisions and was not passing any of my classes. Now, my mentor is like a big brother to me. He gives me good advice and keeps me focused." Today, Edward has A's and B's in all of his classes!

We also partnered with Gregory Kelser, Detroit Pistons Broadcaster on FS Detroit and former Detroit Piston, to implement Winning Futures into his summer basketball camp. Together with Gregory, Sodexo, Powerlink, and the DPS Foundation, we launched our first camp in DPS at Renaissance High School. We had 80 eighth graders from all over the district learning basketball skills, along with participating in our "Shoot for your Goals" program where they set goals, explored their strengths, built positive support teams, and planned for a successful year in high school. Over 75 adults volunteered as Goal-Setting Coaches.

At the camp we had a great surprise - Mayor Dave Bing spoke to the students about what it will take to turn Detroit around, and that it depended on each of them. Mayor Bing reiterated what they had been learning all week from Gregory Kelser and Winning Futures: education comes first!

At the celebration of the 17th Annual Awards Ceremony, 50 students were honored as over 150 parents, educators, volunteer mentors, and local businesses celebrated them. Twelve of the students received scholarships totaling \$24,500. To date we have awarded over \$1.5M in scholarships!

One student who plans to use the scholarship to begin working on his five-year plan at Macomb Commu-

nity College this fall said, "I am so excited to receive this award. It inspires me to continue to work hard as I move towards college, and it will help me make my dreams a reality."

Special honors went out to **Detroit Public Schools** as a new Educational Partner, and the **Detroit Tigers Foundation** with the 2011 President's Award.

We are grateful that Winning Futures, the POH Riley Foundation, and United Way have implemented a mentoring program for our ninth graders. The program is AWESOME! At the very first mentoring session, my students were hooked. I have never seen them engaged and interacting the way they were. This is definitely progress for them. It amazes me to see them working with the mentors and engaging with each other in a positive way.



By the end of this pilot program, 75% of students improved their focus in my class, 90% improved their

attitudes, and almost all of them increased their self-esteem.

My one truant male student is now attending class on a regular basis. One student who did no work in my class is now completing assignments.

The behavior of one of my classes (as a whole) is now more studious. They still talk and play, however, when it is time for work, they work!

This program is just GREAT!
