MENTORS AND ONE-TIME VOLUNTEERS **NEEDED FOR SUMMER AND 2012-13 PROGRAMS**

Winning Futures is currently seeking mentors for the 2012-13 school year and to serve as goal-setting and career coaches for summer programs at schools in Detroit, Madison Heights and Harper Woods.

Mentors will work with gender-specific teams of three or four students for 15 or 25 weeks, one hour once a week at schools in Detroit, Harper Woods, Madison Heights, Pontiac and Warren, Michigan. The goal-setting coaches will work with students at **Durfee Middle School** and **Golightly Educational Center** in Detroit while the goal setting and career coaches will serve at Madison High School and Harper Woods High School.
